ONLINE SAFETY IT STARTS WITH **YOU!**



Use written English at all times when communicating with your teachers or friends when learning.
Leave 'text' chat for times away from learning!



Think carefully how you are dressed when posting videos and images to Seesaw. It is important that you are fully clothed when posting videos or images. Think carefully about the comments you make on other people's work: Is it positive, is it helpful or is it constructive?



Make sure you keep your usernames and passwords organised in your house. You should know where these are at all times. Importantly, don't ever share personal information online.



If something or someone makes you feel upset, worried or confused online then it is important you share this information with a parent or carer.
If in doubt, ask a trusted adult!



Make sure you have regular breaks from screen time and get a good balance between written activities and ICT work!



Make sure you respond to Seesaw tasks on time and you save them in the correct folder in the activities section. If an adult asks you to check over corrections make sure you do this and make changes to your work. If you're finding work too challenging then it is important that you speak with your teacher or an adult at home. Let someone know and they can help!
