Adverse Weather

As always at this time of year, we ask that all children come to school dressed appropriately for the weather. We will make every effort to use the school playground even if it is wet. In the event of adverse weather before school, we have the following arrangement in place:

A member of staff will be positioned at Door A, B and C to allow children entry at 8.45am.

P1-P4 children (excluding P4a) should come straight to Doors B and C and enter the building rather than lining up. Staff will be on hand to take them to the dining hall of the main building where they will be supervised until teachers collect them at 8:55am.

P4a-P7 children should come straight to Door A and enter the building rather than lining up. Staff will be on hand to take them to the gym hall of the main building where they will be supervised until teachers collect them at 8:55am.

School Grounds Access

Please note that from Monday 12th November access to the school playground via King's Park and the P3/4 playground will be restricted between 9.10am and 3.00pm. Access to the school out-with these times should be made via the main entrance gate on Croft Street. Thank you for supporting this change.
