24 members of staff responded to the questionnaire and a summary of the results are contained in this leaflet.

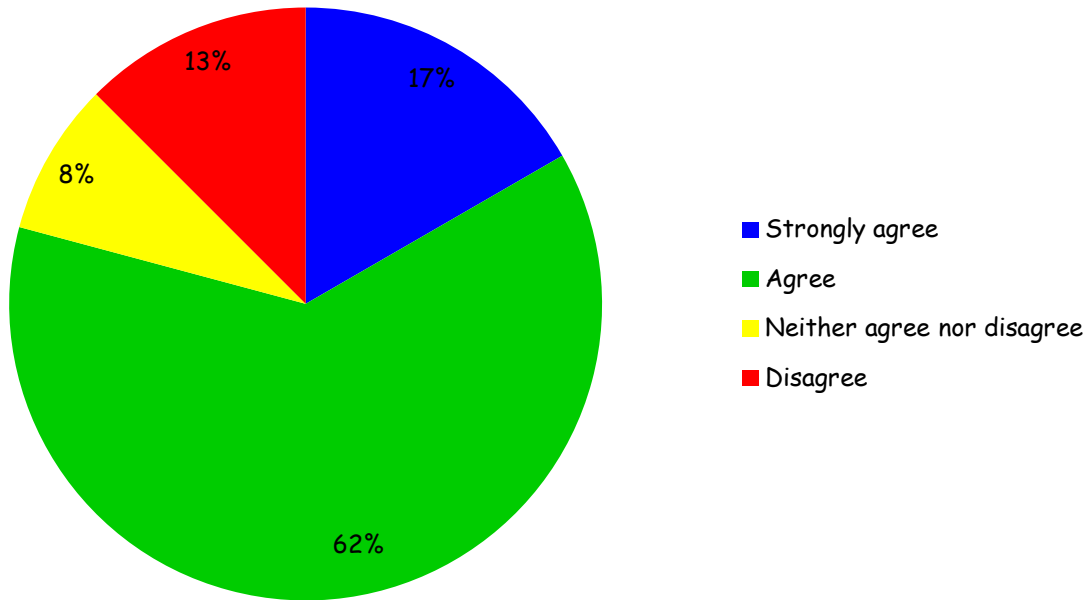

Staff were also given the opportunity to comment on the strengths of the school and areas for improvement.

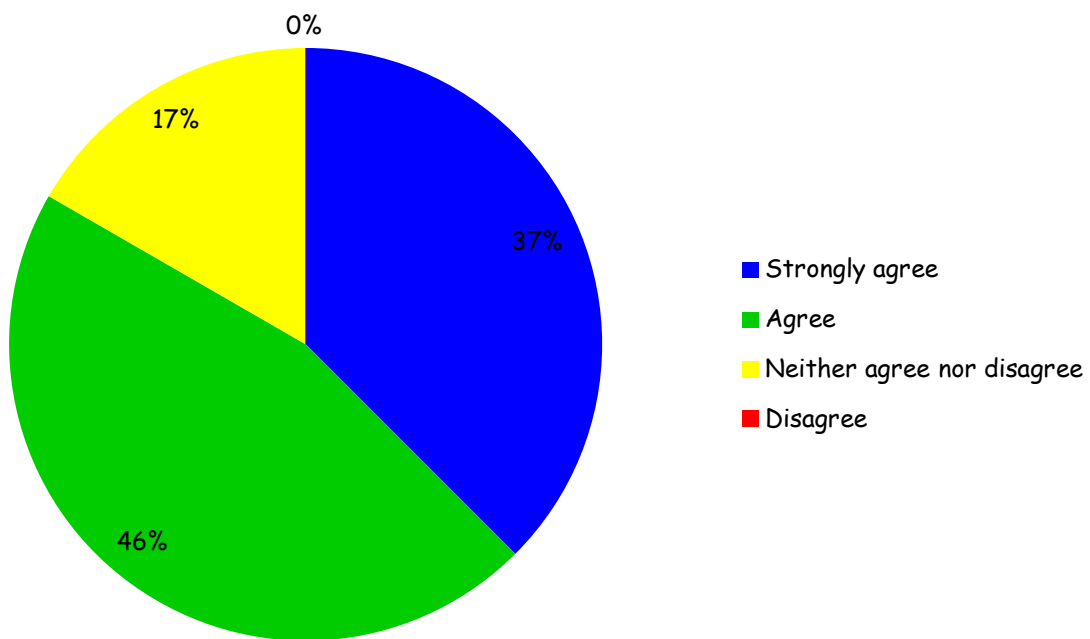

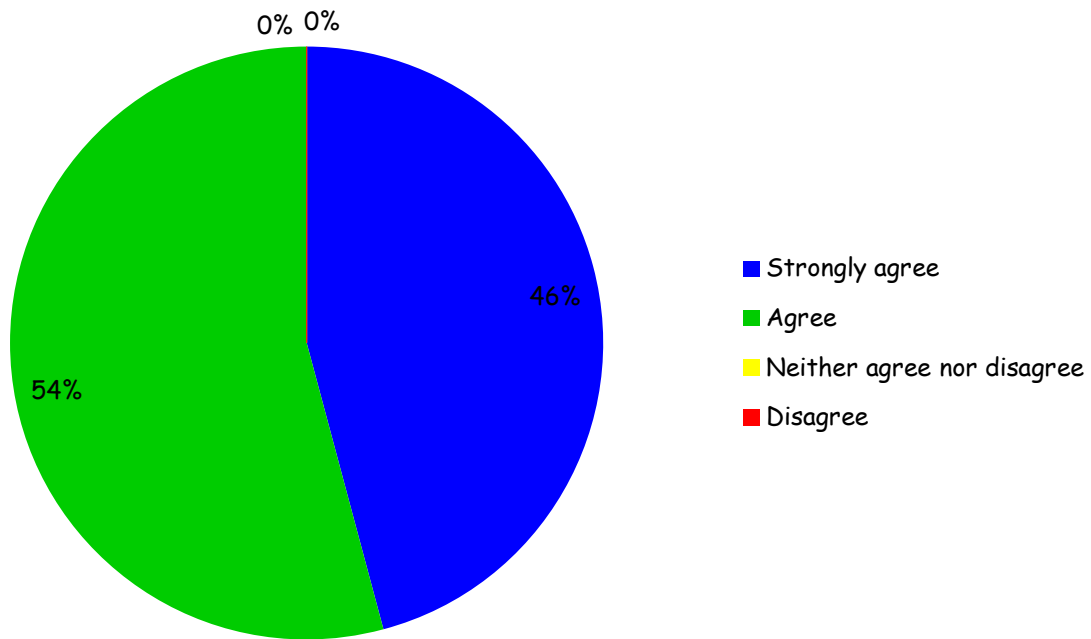
Everyone in our school has opportunities to be able to develop a variety of different interests, talents and learn new skills.



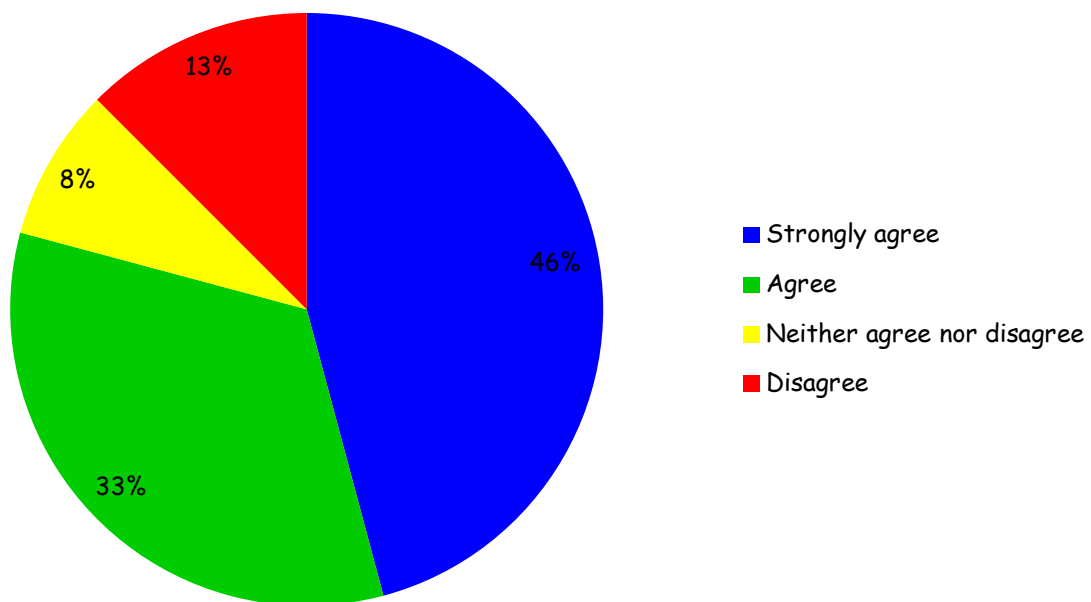
Staff encourage and support all learners to get involved in areas that are of interest to them.



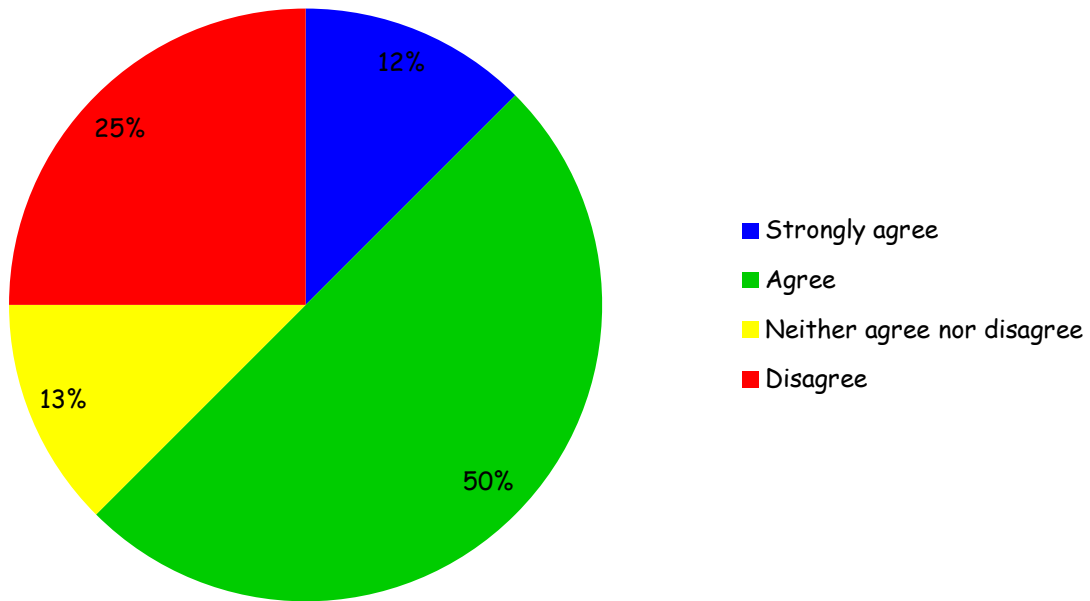
Staffhelp pupils overcome any barriers that might prevent them from taking part.



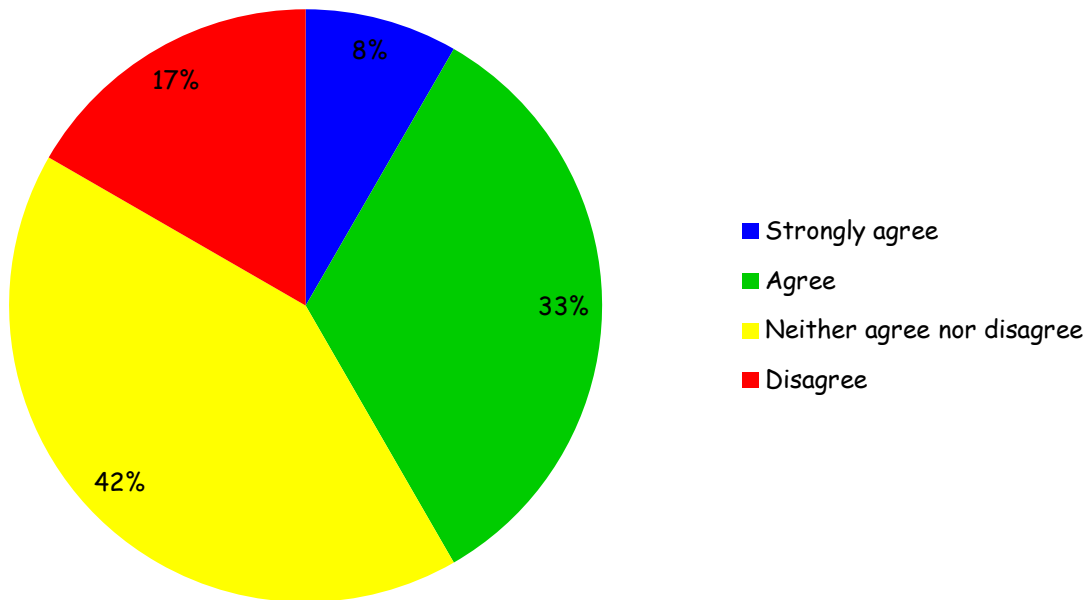
Every child in our school can take part in a group, club, team or activity beyond normal class time if they want to.



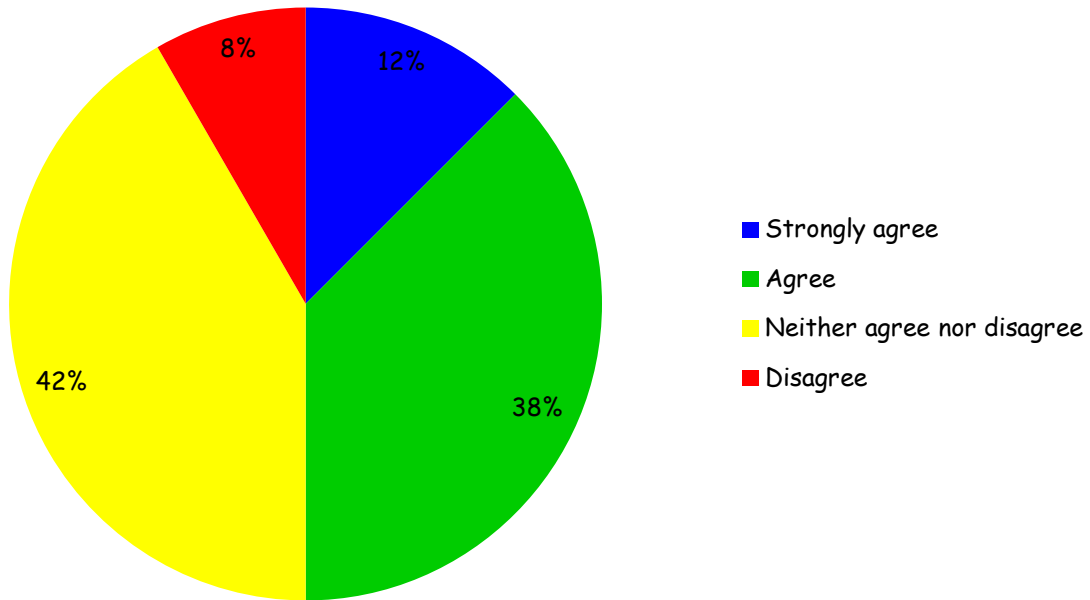
The school recognises and celebrates all pupil participation and achievements.



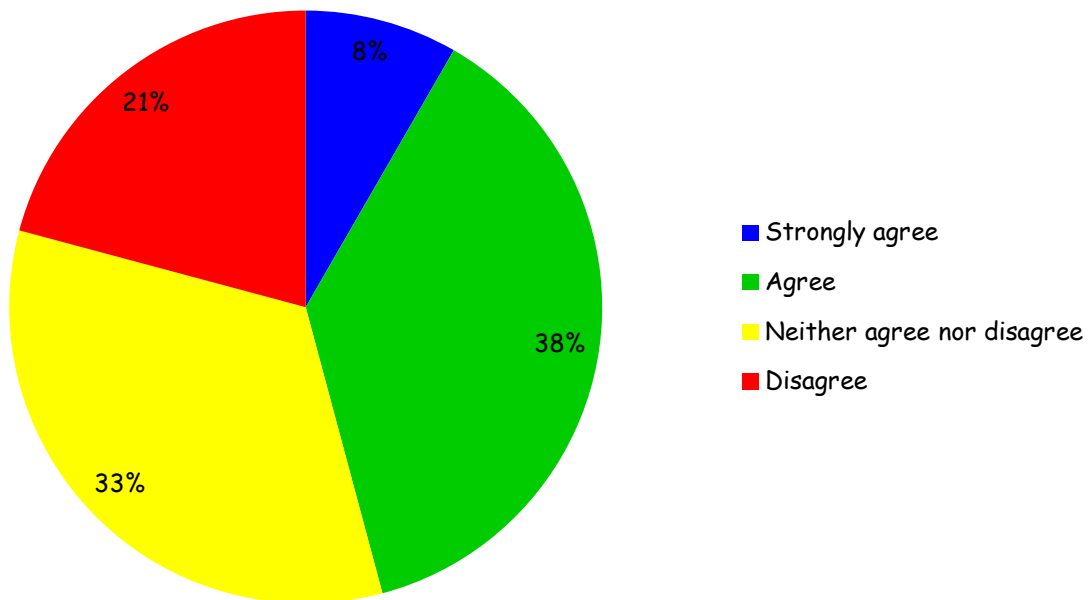
At all stages of school, learners have good opportunities to take responsibility through organising and leading activities.



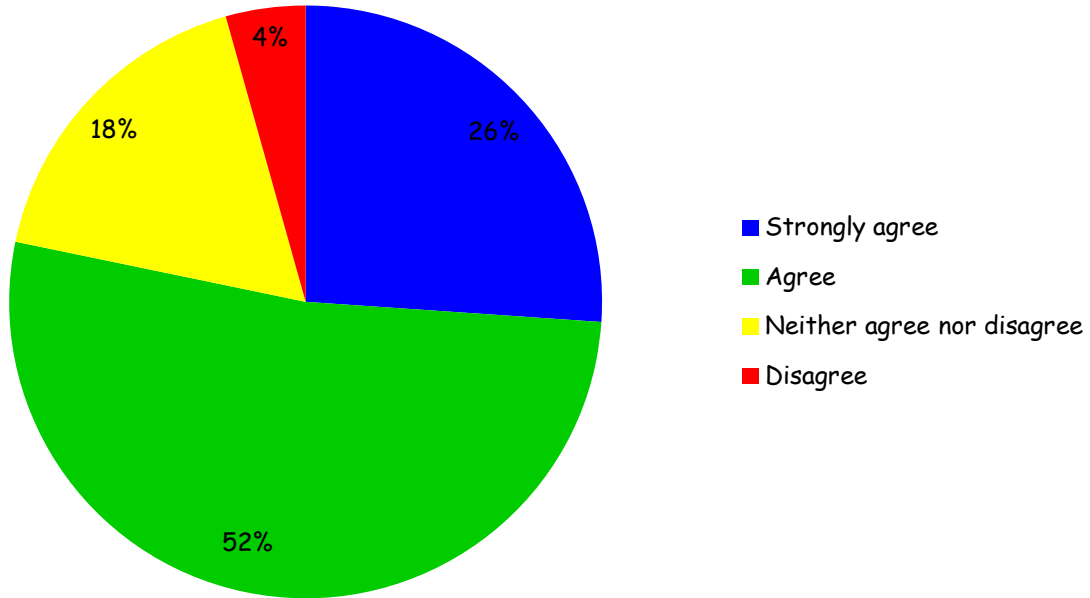
Pupils can talk confidently about the skills they are gaining as a result of leading and organising aspects of school life.



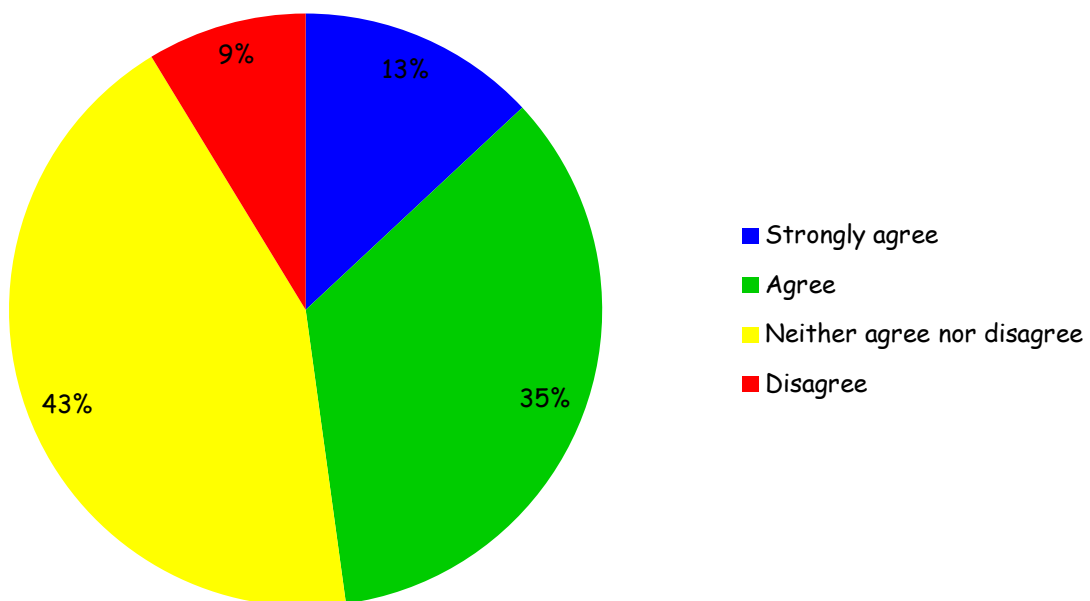
King's Park is helping its learners become more aware of the types of skills needed for different jobs in the future and why these are important.
